

Fireworks Tips

- Class C fireworks are allowed, however they are not to exceed 50 milligrams of explosives.
- You cannot have "display fireworks." These are classified as fireworks which contain more than two grains or 130 milligrams of explosive materials, and professional-grade aerial shells containing more than 60 grams of pyrotechnic compositions and require permits. Leave it to the professionals.
- They cannot be ignited or discharged on public or private property without express permission of the property owner.
- They cannot be discharged within or towards a motor vehicle or building.
- Fireworks cannot be discharged within 150 feet of an occupied structure, whether or not a
 person is actually present.
- Fireworks cannot be discharged while the person is under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance, or another drug.
- LAST BUT NOT LEAST: Be courteous to your neighbors. Many of our veterans who suffer from
 PTSD have a hard time with fireworks, let them know! Please let those who have dogs, horses,
 or other pets know you will be setting off fireworks as well so they can prepare their animals.
